Present: Mayor Clark, Commissioners Forshee, Duddy, Atty. Edison, Clerk Picheo, Tom Barr from the Pioneer News, Officer Cook, Magistrate Joe Laswell and 7guests.

Minutes: Motion to approve the April 7, 2009 minutes with the following corrections to change "Mayor Clark from closing the community center for Shleia Carwile to "Betty closing for Sheila Carwile" and to add "Comm. Tucker made the motion to have the street repaired" was made by Comm. Duddy and was seconded by Comm. Forshee. Passed 3/0.

Motion to approve the April 9, 2009 special meeting minutes was made by Comm. Duddy and seconded by Comm. Allen; Passed 3/0.

Budget: A copy of the monthly statement was handed out and reviewed. Motion to pay monthly bills was made by Comm. Forshee and seconded by Comm. Allen; Motion Passed 3/0.

Officer's Report: Officer Cook reported a total of 9 tours with 20 hours worked and 10 contacts. Officer Cook reported on an observation on an individual who looked suspicious. The next day Officer Cook noticed that the same individual had a warrant out for his arrest. Officer Cook went back and arrested the individual. Jerry Burke called Officer Cook to check out his house on East Hebron lane. Officer Cook stated that the door was opened but there were no signs of forced entry or nothing had shown signs that anything had been trashed.

Officer Leroy reported 20 hours worked with 17 visits and 19 traffic stops all were speeding with 4 citations. Leroy stated that he cited someone doing 53 mph on Burkland Blvd. He also reported on stopping a couple on trucks. Leroy reported a situation where a student ran into a resident's mailbox in East Hebron and resolved that situation. He also addressed a concern with the teachers who direct traffic in the early mornings without flashlights or vests. The officer explained that he did speak with the principle to address the situation. The officer offered an idea that due to the turnover of students every year that maybe the city could put out a letter notifying the students of the speed limits and traffic laws. Mayor Clark asked Atty. Edison to put together a letter.

Old Business: Atty. Edison read the seconded reading of Ordinance 2009-01 regulation of signs. Motion to approve Ordinance 2009-01 Regulation of Signs was made by Comm. Forshee and seconded by Comm. Duddy; Passed 3/0.

Clerk Picheo stated that the city has 4 tax bills that have not been paid.

Resident Shelia Carwile asked if she could speak. Shelia Carwile handed out and read a letter regarding her denial to rent the Community Center. Comm. Forshee asked Shelia if the council agreed to let her rent the building for future use would she abide by the terms of the agreement including the signing of the checklist. Shelia said "yes". Comm. Duddy asked her if she only used the building for the church group and she said no. Mayor Clark clarified that if the building was going to be used for a different reason or party then another security deposit would have to be given. The council agreed to allow Sheila to use the building.

New Business:

Atty. Edison read the first reading of Ordinance 2009-02 Budget for Fiscal year July 1,2009 to June 30, 2010.

Mayor Clark led a discussion on an unpermitted signed for Notebook Learning. Mayor Clark asked Atty. Edison to send a letter notifying them of the city's ordinance.

Mayor Clark reminded the residents and council that the city wide yard sale will take place on May16th with a rain date May 23rd.

Mayor Clark led a discussion on the county looking for volunteers to help enroll people for the free prescription program. He asked if anyone was interested to please contact the city clerk.
