MINUTES REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING 7PM, JANUARY 4, 2022

Regular City Council Meeting of Hebron Estates, Mayor Jerry Clark called the meeting to order at 7:00pm on January 4, 2021.

Commissioners present Robert Denner, Russell Forshee, James Tucker. and Kathy Merrifield. Also, in attendance: City Attorney, Mark Edison and City Clerk, Micheale McCauley

Invocation: James Tucker All Recited the Pledge of Allegiance

- → City Clerk McCauley read the regular meeting minutes from December 7, 2021. James Tucker made a motion to accept the regular meeting minutes as read. Robert Denner 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ♣ Robert Denner made a motion to accept the financial report for December 31, 2021. Kathy Merrifield 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried

OLD BUSINESS

- ♣ Attorney Edison explained the Text Amendments 2021T-01 & 2021T-02 involving multi family R3 zoned properties to make lots larger with more green space and must submit a site plan. Mayor Clark and the Commissioner's decided not to take action, on the advice of City Attorney Edison.
- → City Clerk McCauley informed all that the 2021 delinquent taxes totaled to 39 unpaid parcels with 28 owners.
- ♣ Mayor Clark read the estimate for drainage work on ditch behind Hebron Estates Community Center with a total of \$13922.00 which would go from the Corbin property to the Hebron Estates property line. Attorney Edison advised the City could not use ARPA funds for the project due to the final interim rule on spending of ARPA funds not finalized. Mayor Clark advises that this project would be a benefit to the City. James Tucker made a motion to accept the estimate from RLH Rentals for \$13922.00 for drainage work on ditch behind Hebron Estates Community Center. Robert Denner 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

- → Mayor Clark read the Proclamation recognizing January 23-29, 2022 as City of Hebron Estates School Choice Week.
- ☐ James Tucker made a motion to junk the Epson printer used in the Mayor's office. Russell Forshee 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried. The printer is being replaced by an all-in-one Brother printer.
- ♣ Attorney Edison read the 1st reading of Ordinance 2022-01 Establish Compensation of the Commissioners to \$200.00 per month effective 01/01/2023.
- → Attorney Edison read the 1st reading of Ordinance 2022-02 Establish Compensation of the Mayor to \$700.00 per month effective 01/01/2023.

♣ None.

POLICE BUSINESS

- ♣ Mayor Clark and the Commissioners raised the DARE donation from \$500 in 2019 to \$1000.00 in 2022 due to the school being in Hebron Estates. The program is funded by donations from the public. Kathy Merrifield made a motion to donate \$1000.00 to help fund the 2022 DARE Program instructed by Chief DJ Reynolds at Freedom Elementary to the 80 5th graders. Robert Denner 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ♣ Chief Reynold's report includes some of the 180 calls for service to the Pioneer Village Police Department:
 - o 12/8 at North Bullitt HS possible threat to shoot up the school. The Pioneer Village Police and the Bullitt County Sheriff's Office were not able to get any leads from the social media app, Snapchat.
 - o 12/10 on Tony Ln report of a missing person. He was taken to the hospital.
 - o 12/27 on Scenic Trl report of an EPO violation. Her nephew keeps texting her. She was told to follow up with the County Attorney's office.
 - o 2021 Santa's Helper Program was a huge success, helping 84 kids. Overall donations were very generous this year. We were able to help two other organizations with items that were donated back in the summer not needed for the children's Christmas.
 - o We made it through New Year's Eve with no problems or issues. Several people were shooting guns off.
 - 2022 DARE Program will start January 5th for the next 12 weeks at Freedom and Maryville Elementary Schools.
 - o Wish everyone a Happy and Safe New Year!!

PUBLIC BUSINESS

- → Mayor Clark advised that Bullitt County is set to amend the Insurance Tax Premium to include a sunset provision at the end of current fiscal year. Attorney Edison advised the Mayor and Commissioner to hold off until March to amend the Hebron Estates Insurance Tax Premium Ordinance to include a sunset provision.
- ♣ Resident Kathy Morgan asked Mayor Clark to remove the speed hump in her driveway. Mayor Clark said he will have it removed.
